KINROSS POLICE RANGERS

The Police Ranger program at Kinross College, in conjunction with Cadets WA, offers students in Yrs 8-12 amazing opportunities to develop an array of self-management, interpersonal and outdoor skills, along with knowledge of the WA Police Force. The program has a strong focus on leadership development and allows students to forge friendships and build confidence and resilience, while maintaining respect and discipline within a ranking system. Our partnerships with Cadets WA and the Department of Communities allows us to offer this program at a heavily subsidised cost.

Units of competence include:

- Policing
- Drill and ceremony
- Land operations
- Navigation
- Communications
- Physical skills and training
- Safety - including risk identification/assessment/management
- Leadership
- Community service

A wide range of programs are offered within Parade times that not only provide opportunity for Rangers to demonstrate the required competencies, but also engage in fun / active learning experiences relevant to their local community and available facilities.

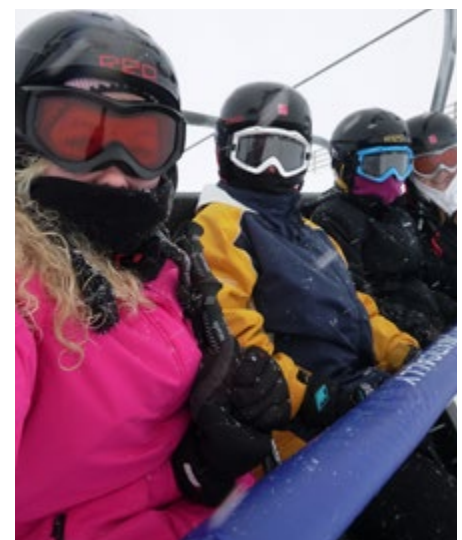
Rangers have access to 4 camps each year which are designed to allow them the opportunity to apply the competencies they have developed within Parade times. We offer a cycling or kayaking camp in Term 1, a roping camp (climbing, abseiling etc) camp in Term 2, a hiking camp in Term 3 and a 'combination camp' in Term 4. All camps foster team building and leadership.

Rangers also have access to apply formal drill and ceremonial procedures through their involvement in ANZAC assemblies and parades, along with the annual Police Ranger Open Day and the State Ranger Rally.

All Rangers participate in formal training such as Essential and Senior First Aid courses, Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue qualifications, in order to build their capacity to identify and manage risks and become actively contributing members of the broader community.

Kinross Police Rangers have access to International programs such as World Challenge, a month long expedition to a less developed country designed to physically, personally and socially challenge students and our New Zealand ski trip, providing opportunity for students to actively engage in environments physically and culturally different to our own.

Rangers are recognised for their achievement of competencies and for demonstrating excellence in leadership, through a formal Graduation Ceremony at the end of the year, where many Rangers achieve promotion to the next rank. All instructors and students within the unit abide by the Ranger Oath and Code of Conduct demonstrating respect and service to others. Students in the Ranger program consistently develop and model skills, attitudes and values that have a positive impact on their schooling as well as their social interactions.
